

<p>OCTOBER Thurs 7 Oct Talk</p>	<p><i>The Rylstone Log-Coffin Burial: a nationally-important prehistoric site and its context in Upper Wharfedale.</i> Dr Roger Martlew will illustrate the insights that can be gained by using new techniques to examine material that has been held for many years in museum collections, including the Craven Museum. Building on a published account of detective work on this important site at Rylstone, Dr Martlew will cast a critical eye over our current understanding of its local context, and suggest avenues for future research.</p>

In this talk, Dr Kenneth Jackson examines the uses of water power, the extraction and transport of limestone, and the way in which these activities shaped the woodland landscape.</p>
